Introduction

This document contains historic addresses of our Filipek and Nemec ancestors and is available on [Our Filipek Family Web Pages](#) as part of our Filipek family history. This listing is restricted to deceased families or members of our Filipek and Nemec family lines.

For ease of use, the above [Table of Contents](#) includes active links along with a simplified genealogy chart to assist in selecting items of interest. Merely touch the line or page number to move to a section of interest.

Following are *Filipek Family Census Records* for two family surnames that led to our current Jordans all of whom are part of *The Filipek Story*. These *Census Records* begin with the Antonin and Katerina Filipek Family of Kolence, Bohemia and include some of their descendants. After the Filipek addresses, the Martin and Katerina Nemec Family of Bohemia is listed. One branch of each family led to our Filipeks of Chicago and later our Jordans of Chicago.

Census Records were obtained from a number of sources and these are generally indicated in the notes section following each transcribed census record.

The census and thus census records are organized around households and thus the various census records that are indexed in the above *Table of Contents* are titled by the Head of Household and their spouse. Census records for an individual when younger are generally with their parent's.

Spellings of names and places vary for different records and sometimes individuals changed some part of their names or used nicknames or abbreviations. In the transcriptions that follows, the names are transcribed as they were recorded in the original record source.

In order to help preserve our family history and to make that history more widely available, [Our Filipek Family Web Pages](#) was created in the early years of the 21st century.

While quite successful in its goals, it became clear with the passage of time, that a web site with many hundreds of pages was not easy to print or to electronically download. Thus in the later part of the first decade of the 21st century, I began to compile various categories of information such as *Jordan Family Address Lists*, *Jordan Family Census Records*, *Jordan Genealogy Source Records*, *Oscar Scholdberg's Voyages*, *Recollections of the Jordans and the Jordan Stories* into pdf documents.

Such pdf files will make it easier to download files for preservation on our many computers and they will also allow much easier printing of pages and for studied analysis as desired. As part of this effort, a [Filipek and Nemec PDF Downloads](#) web page was created. From this page, all

currently available pdf's from [Our Filipek Family Web Pages](#) and [Our Nemec Family Web Pages](#) can be accessed.

You are encouraged to download the various Filipek and Nemec pdf files, not only for your own study but to also help preserve for future generations hard to obtain data and information about our common Filipek, Nemec and Jordan origins and history. Files are updated every once in a while, and checking about once a year is a reasonable frequency. Version dates are shown at the beginning of the [Table of Contents](#).

You may have noted that the current document is quite lengthy and contains information for not only the Filipeks but also the Nemecs, and Sokoliks. While it might have made sense to focus this document on one family or a family line with the same surname, my worry was that there would have been a proliferation of pdf files. Many scattered files and associated updates would make it harder to find and save all the related and connected information. Thus all have been placed within the current file.

Notes

1. Tomas Filipek and Marie Ann Jirakova were married 24 November 1776 in Kolence; their children are listed in the genealogy above. Marie Ann Jirakova Filipek died in the 1780s and Tomas Filipek then married Anna Forst on 8 October 1786. The genealogy from his

second marriage has been developed by John and Debbie Shuck. Their tree can be seen on [Rootsweb World Connect Project](#). Select *Family Trees*, then enter *Filipek* as the Surname and *Tomas* as the Given Name. Select the *Tomas* with a birth year of 1752.

2. All eight Antonin and Katerina Filipek children were born at Farm No.16, Kolence, Bohemia, Czechoslovakia. It was then known as the Filipek Family Farm.
3. James F. Filipek came to Chicago in 1911 with Uncle Vaclav Filipek. He became known in Chicago as *Jim the Gardener* because of his work as horticulturalist. He was also known as *Big Jim* because he was much taller than his cousin Jim (James A. Filipek).
4. All births for the Jan and Franceska Filipek children were in Minnesota.
5. It is unclear whether the original name in Bohemia was Jana or Janu. There is some information suggesting the original family name was Janu, but to date no genealogy record from Czechoslovakia has been obtained to verify this. Most references to the family in the United States use Jana, Janna or Yanna. Since the earliest known use is Jana and is consistent in early records, Jana will be used throughout these pages. It should be noted however that various phonetic spellings such as Gunia, Yana, and Yanna and have been found in numerous records by BH. It appears the extended family evolved over time to the consistent use of Yanna. Perhaps this is because Americans would pronounce Yanna correctly to their ear, but would pronounce Jana with the "J" sound.

Antonin and Katerina Filipek's Census Records

Antonin Filipek was born 25 March 1815 on Farm No. 16, Kolence, Bohemia. Katerina Ceckova was born 5 April 1833 at No. 13 Zablazi, Bohemia. They married 9 October 1849 at Lomnice, Bohemia.

Antonin Filipek died 27 June 1900 in Bohemia and Katerina Filipek died 12 November 1902.

It is believed they lived their entire lives at Farm No. 16, Kolence, Bohemia, which was known as the Filipek Family Farm and had been a Filipek farm since the later 1500s.

Census Records

No Census Records have been obtained, but they likely exist.

Frantisek and Anna Sokolik's Census Records

Frantisek Sokolik was born 29 November 1832 at Farm No. 9, Kolence in Bohemia. Anna Filipek was born 17 January 1853 at Farm no. 16 in Kolence. Her parents were Anton and Katerina Filipek. They were married 18 February 1873 probably at Novosedly. They sold Farm No. 9 to Frantisek Palecek and Mary Filipek on 26 March 1879 and emigrated to Minnesota in May 1879. The first Census records begin in 1880 in Minnesota.

After Anna's death about 1887, the two youngest boys (John and Theodore Sokolik) were taken in by Frantisek and Katerina Jana. Katerina was Anna's sister. Frank Sokolik and the oldest son Frank then became disconnected from the Janas and the two sons John and Theodore and were never reunited.

An attempt has been made to reproduce all data exactly as it is on the original census record; some column heading wording changes have been made for brevity.

5. Terry notes that "The enumerator was a horrendous speller and he spelled their name Sopolik. I am certain it is them. Next door to them is the Gunia (Jana) family and although again grossly misspelled I am certain it is them especially as I compare to the 1880 census. Frank and Katerina Gunia in 1885 have four children the same daughter

Kate as in 1880 who is now 5 and three other children ranging from 0-4 years.

John and Katherine Sokolik's Census Records

John K. Sokolik was born 4 February 1876 at Farm No. 9, Kolence, Bohemia. His parents were Frantisek and Anna Sokolik. Katherine Popel was born 1879 in Bohemia. They were married 25 June 1904 in Chicago.

John was a small boy when he left Kolence with his parents for Minnesota in May 1879. After his mother's death about 1887, he and his brother Theodore were taken in by Frantisek and Katerina Jana. Katerina was his mother's sister. Katerina Jana died about 1889-1890 and during this period he and his brother Theodore were taken in by James and Katherine Filipek in Chicago. James Filipek was their mother's brother.

John K. Sokolik died 1 December 1953 in Chicago and Katherine Sokolik died in 1962.

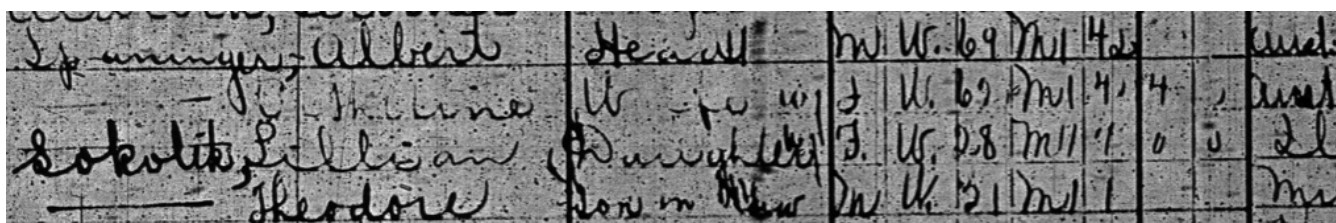

Frank Jana was born 6 August 1855 in Prague, Bohemia. He migrated to the USA in the 1870s. Katerina Filipek was born 15 July 1858 at Farm No. 16, Kolence, Bohemia. Her parents were Anton and Katerina Filipek. They were married 21 October 1879 at Heidelberg, Minnesota.

It appears she traveled from Bohemia to Minnesota on her own in 1879 and she joined her sister and brother-in-law Frantisek and Anna Sokolik in Minnesota. Katerina Jana died in 1889 or 1890 after the birth of her last child Elizabeth who was born 6 July 1889 in Rush City, Minnesota.

Frank Jana then moved to Chicago Illinois where he married Annie Jirsa on 2 November 1890 in Chicago. He then took the family to Colorado during the 1890s.

Census information is shown below.
8. At about the time James Filipek died, sons John and James were beginning to live elsewhere and establishing their careers. But perhaps the death of her husband and daughter Mary brought them together. By 1916 they all lived together again about 5 miles south of the 3001 S. Emerald home and grocery store. Since they didn't sell the store, one would assume that they hired others, such as the butcher to run the store. It's pretty clear that the boys had other interests such as sales, insurance and the law. James A. Filipek enlisted for WWI in May 1918 and returned from the Army of Occupation in August 1919.

In April 1920, shortly after this census, he married Grace Vanderkloot.

9. It's curious that Mary Barrett, the granddaughter Katherine raised is not shown, nor is her father Larry. She would only have been about 4 years old.

Comments on Year of Birth Analysis

1. It appears Katherine may have adjusted her year of birth to be younger than her husband. This may have been a common practice of the times as it has been found in other records of this era where a slightly older wife claims to be younger and sometimes the husband claims to be slightly older. By 1920, Katherine has settled in on being two years younger than she was using a year of birth of 1864 instead of 1862. It is possible by then that she either didn't remember or had used 1864 so often she just continued to use it. Her 1914 and 1929 passport also use a year of birth of 1864.
2. It is unclear why the ages for the children John, Mary and James are off by one to two years for the 1900 Census since they are so young. One would think their ages would be well known. The data for Mary and James are corrected in the 1910 Census and John's is corrected by the 1920 Census.

Comments on Marriage Year Analysis

1. Above is an analysis of Filipek birth years, marriage years and immigration years based on census and other data.
2. Katherine Filipek's 1929 Passport Application indicates her marriage date was January 29, 1884, which is in the range indicated by the 1900 Census and the 1930 Census. The 1910 Census appears to be an attempt to show a marriage before John's birth, which is not correct as his baptismal record indicates otherwise.
3. To date the Filipek marriage location and marriage records have not been found. The overall search range is December 1882 to October 1884.
4. A careful search was done in January 2002 of the microfilmed St. John Nepomucene marriage records. While all the Filipek children's baptismal records were found, the Filipek marriage was not.
5. An on-line search of the Illinois Marriage Records has been done and no match was found. This search should be repeated as more data is added to the database.
6. One hypothesis is that Katerina and baby John returned to Bohemia and Vaclav Filipek and Katerina Nemeč were married in January 1884 in their home province.

7. Another hypothesis is that they were married in another state, such as Minnesota where various Filipek relatives resided such as brother John Filipek or sisters Anna Sokolik and Katerina Jana.

Comments on Immigration Year Analysis

1. Based on his Baptismal Record, it is known that John Filipek was born in Chicago on December 13, 1882. Thus Katherine Nemec arrived in the USA sometime during the summer of 1882. A ship arrival record indicates Kath Nemec, age 20 from Bohemia arrived in New York 5 July 1882 on the Strassburg via Bremen. It is believed this is our Katherine Nemec
2. It is also known that James (Vaclav) Filipek was in Agronomics School in Bohemia in September 1884.
3. One hypothesis suggests that James came to Chicago in 1883 and that Katherine and he were married somewhere in the USA in January 1884. They both could then have returned to Bohemia and then immigrated with their son John in 1889. If they both returned to Bohemia then the marriage might instead have taken place in Bohemia.
4. A second hypotheses is that James (Vaclav) Filipek came to Chicago in 1883, they were married, but he returned to Bohemia while she stayed in Chicago with their son.
5. An third hypothesis is that James (Vaclav) Filipek never came to Chicago in 1883 but Katherine and her child John went back to Bohemia where they were married. All three then emigrated to Chicago about May 1889.
6. A fourth possibility is that Katherine stayed in Chicago with John from 1882 until James (Vaclav) Filipek arrived in 1889. However, this does not account for the 1884 marriage date nor the 1889 arrival date shown on the 1900 Census.
7. Without the marriage record and location, it is unknown which of these hypothesis is correct.
8. Their son John Filipek is shown as immigrating in 1889 in the 1900 Census but no immigration entry is made for the 1910, 1920 or 1930 Census. It is unclear how to interpret this inconsistency.

- Both Dwelling Number and Family Number are artificial numbers used by the census enumerator.
- The above census data was found in a October, 2000 search by Terry Nelson. The record was located through the use of the Soundex system.
- Of interest is that the Filipeks moved back to 3001 Emerald after being away from about 1914 to at least 1917. See *Historical Filipek Family Addresses*; File: *Addresses_Filipek_Historical.pdf*.
- The home was owned as also shown in the 1910 census, however, it was no longer mortgaged. It is believed the the grocery store location was sold in 1921. In the 1920 Census Record John is shown as owner and as head of the household. However, it is unclear if he was the actual owner or if it was his mother Katherine Filipek or both.
- The year of immigration is difficult to read. It might be 1881, 1882, or 1887. Katherine arrived in 1882.
- Katherine answered "Unknown" for her year of naturalization; however it was April 2, 1900 and she obtained her naturalization through her husband.
- There was also a boarder living at 3001 S. Emerald. He was a butcher which suggests that he worked at the grocery and that they sold meat at the store. This helps verify Grace Filipek's recollection that Vaclav was a butcher at the store. Pictures of the inner store made it seem as if there were only grocery dry goods, fruits and bread. Census information is shown after Katherine Filipek's 1920 Census Record.

8. At about the time James Filipek died, sons John and James were beginning to live elsewhere and establishing their careers. But perhaps the death of her husband and daughter Mary brought them together. By 1916 they all lived together again about 5 miles south of the 3001 S. Emerald home and grocery store. Since they didn't sell the store, one would assume that they hired others, such as the butcher to run the store. It's pretty clear that the boys had other interests such as sales, insurance and the law. James A. Filipek enlisted for WWI in May 1918 and returned from the Army of Occupation in August 1919. In April 1920, shortly after this census, he married Grace Vanderkloot.
9. It's curious that Mary Barrett, the granddaughter Katherine raised is not shown, nor is her father Larry. She would only have been about 4 years old.

6. At the same address, 7304 S. Emerald, but likely on a different floor there is also listed a Daniel and Alice Vanderkloot, along with their daughter Ruth. It is believed this Daniel Vanderkloot is a son of Marinus and Maatje Vanderkloot. Jeanne indicated the building was 6 flat owned by Clair and Coby Vanderkloot. At this time, it is not known who Coby Vanderkloots parents were.

1. Both Dwelling Number and Family Number are artificial numbers used by the census enumerator.
2. The above census data was found in a September, 2000 search by Terry Nelson. The record was located through the use of the Soundex system.
3. It was decided to search for the Dedinas because Marie Dedina was the baptismal sponsor for Mary Filipek in 1889 and Vojtech (Albert) Dedina was the baptismal sponsor for James A. Filipek in 1892. This was a new surname in our research but usually baptismal sponsors are relatives or very close friends. It is still not clear whether the Dedinas were relatives or friends, but it appears to be close friends.
4. One interesting observation is that the Dedinas son, Edward was born in November 1882 just one month before Katherine's son John Filipek was born. Thus Katherine Nemecek and Rose Dedina were pregnant at the same time. Perhaps this led to a good friendship

between Rose Dedina and Katherine who we believe may have lived next door to Katherine while she lived with the Novaks.

5. Marie Dedina, who was Mary's baptismal sponsor is not shown in the Census record. Perhaps she was an older daughter who had married by 1900.
6. Of some interest is that the 187 24th Place address in the Census Record is the same that James (Vaclav) Filipek stayed at from 1892 and 1894. Thus suggesting there continued to be a period they all lived near each other.
7. An extract from Leo Baca's Czech Immigration Passenger Lists indicated that an Adabert Dedina, age 25 and a Rosalie Dedina, age 23 from Bohemia arrived in New York on the Freihandel on 20 July 1872. Their destination was Chicago.

The 1900, 1910, 1920, 1930 and 1940 Chicago Censuses can be located using the Soundex system. The Soundex System uses a phonetic method to organize surnames. The value of the Soundex system is that a name can be found relatively easily even if names were spelled differently than the way they are expected to be spelled. Unusual spellings occurred for several reasons including census takers not always being careful in accurately recording the spelling of our ancestors' names or that our ancestors did not always spell their names in a consistent way. Under the Soundex system, the surnames Filipek and Filipak would be placed together.

The 1890 Census was destroyed by fire.

Access to the Chicago Census, as part of the total U.S. Census, is readily available at a number of locations. In particular, searches have been made over the years at the National Archives in Washington D.C., the National Archive Regional Branch in Bayonne, New Jersey, the National Archive Regional Branch in Chicago, the Newberry Library in Chicago, and the Allen County Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Around the year 2000, the USA census data became increasingly available on-line. By 2010 all USA census information were available on-line via a number of websites and genealogy sites such as *Ancestry*, and *Footnote*.
