Introduction

This document contains historic addresses of our Tansi and Vanderkloot ancestors and is available on [Our Vanderkloot Family Web Pages](#) as part of our Vanderkloot family history. This listing is restricted to deceased families or members of our Tanis and Vanderkloot family lines.

For ease of use, the above [Table of Contents](#) includes active links along with a simplified genealogy chart to assist in selecting items of interest. Merely touch the line or page number to move to a section of interest.

Following are *Vanderkloot Family Census Records* for two family surnames that led to our current Jordans all of whom are part of *The Vanderkloot Story*. These *Census Records* begin with the Adrianus and Maatje Vanderkloot Family of Holland and include some of their descendants. After the *Vanderkloot Census Records*, the Dirk and Cornelia Tanis Family of Holland is listed. One branch of each family led to our Vanderkloots of Chicago and later our Jordans of Chicago.

Census Records were obtained from a number of sources and these are generally indicated in the notes section following each transcribed census record.

The census and thus census records are organized around households and thus the various census records that are indexed in the above *Table of Contents* are titled by the Head of Household and their spouse. Census records for an individual when younger are generally with their parent's.

Spellings of names and places vary for different records and sometimes individuals changed some part of their names or used nicknames or abbreviations. In the transcriptions that follows, the names are transcribed as they were recorded in the original record source.

In order to help preserve our family history and to make that history more widely available, [Our Vanderkloot Family Web Pages](#) was created in the early years of the 21st century.

While quite successful in its goals, it became clear with the passage of time, that a web site with many hundreds of pages was not easy to print or to electronically download. Thus in the later part of the first decade of the 21st century, I began to compile various categories of information such as *Jordan Family Address Lists*, *Jordan Family Census Records*, *Jordan Genealogy Source Records*, *Oscar Scholdberg's Voyages*, *Recollections of the Jordans and the Jordan Stories* into pdf documents.

Such pdf files will make it easier to download files for preservation on our many computers and they will also allow much easier printing of pages and for studied analysis as desired. As part of this effort, a [Vanderkloot and Tanis PDF Downloads](#) web page was created. From this

page, all currently available pdf's from [Our Vanderkloot Family Web Pages](#) and out [Our Tanis Family Web Pages](#) can be accessed.

You are encouraged to download the various Vanderkloot and Tanis pdf files, not only for your own study but to also help preserve for future generations hard to obtain data and information about our common Vanderkloot, Tanis and Jordan origins and history. Files are updated every once in a while, and checking about once a year is a reasonable frequency. Version dates are shown at the beginning of the [Table of Contents](#).

You may have noted that the current document is quite lengthy and contains information for not only the Vanderkloot but also the Tanises. While it might have made sense to focus this document on one family or a family line with the same surname, my worry was that there would have been a proliferation of pdf files. Many scattered files and associated updates would make it harder to find and save all the related and connected information. Thus all have been placed within the current file.

Adrianus and Maatje Vanderkloot's Census Records

Adrianus Matthijs van der Kloot was born 19 January 1798 in Oud-Vossemeer, Tholen, Zeeland, Netherlands. Maatje Dominé was born 6 January 1804 in Middelharnis, Goeree-Overflakkee in Zuid-Holland, Netherlands. Adrianus and Maatje were married on 19 October 1823 probably in Middelharnis in Zuid-Holland

Adrianus died 19 November 1874 in Haarlemmermeer, Noord Holland. Maatje Dominé died 12 September 1888 in Haarlemmermeer, Noord Holland.

Adrianus and Maatje Vanderkloot's Texel Registers

Gemeente-Texel Population Registers-Texel

A January 19, 1978 letter from the Gemeente Secretarie van Texel provided the following information from the Population Registers for the Vanderkloots:

Adrianus van der Kloot born in 1798 at Oud-Vossemeer, he was reformed and his profession was smith, he was married with

Maatje Dominé, she was born in 1804 in Middelharnis

Their children included:

1. Matthijs, born in 1827 at Middelharnis;
2. Jannetje, born in 1829 at Middelharnis;
3. Martina, born in 1834 at Middelharnis.

They moved in March 1856 to Haarlemmermeer.

Texel Notes

1. Some of the information from this extract of the Population Register appears incomplete. For example, it implies all the children moved with Adrianus and Maatje to Haarlemmermeer. However, Matthijs continued to stay at De Cocksdorp, Texel until about 1886. It is also thought that Martina died on August 11, 1848 but perhaps the data was for another Martina. Perhaps, the "they" only refers to Adrianus and Maatje.
2. May 16, 2000 e-mail from Miriam Klassen: According to the Population Registration of Texel the roots of the Van der Kloot-family are situated in Middelharnis. Around 1836 the master smith Adrianus van der Kloot, his wife Maartje Domine and their six children Marinus, Teuntje, Matthijs, Adriaantje, Jannetje and Martina moved to Texel. Adrianus and his brother Jacob van der Kloot were hired by De Cock, one of the owners of the new reclamation Eierland. In March 1856 they moved to the Haarlemmermeer, another reclamation in the province Noord-Holland. Only Teuntje stayed behind, because she married 23-6-1842 Texel with Aart Nieman.

Adrianus and Maatje Vanderkloot's Haarlemmermeer Registers

Gemeente-Haarlemmermeer Population Registers-Haarlemmermeer

A April 26, 1978 letter from the Gemeente Secretarie van Haarlemmermeer provided the following information from the Population Registers for the Vanderkloots:

1. It is thought that Martina died on August 11, 1848 but perhaps the data was for another Martina.

Marinus and Meis Vanderkloot's Census Records

Marinus Adrianus van der Kloot was born 7 November 1824 probably near Middelharnis in Zuid-Holland. His parents were Adrianus and Maatje Vanderkloot.

Meis Teunis Koning born 7 November 1827 in Oosterend, Texel, Netherlands. They were married 22 February 1849 in Texel. They and their children migrated to Chicago in the 1868. Marinus Vanderkloot was the founder of the *Vanderkloot Iron Works*.

Meis Vanderkloot died in 1882 probably in Chicago. Marinus then may have married a woman named Catherine. Marinus Vanderkloot died in 1891 in Chicago.

Census Records

1. No Dutch Population Records have been obtained, but they likely exist for the areas they lived in the Netherlands.

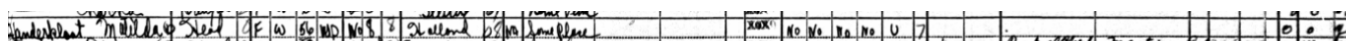

1900 Census Notes

An attempt has been made to reproduce all data exactly as it is on the original census record; some column heading wording changes have been made for brevity.

1. Both Dwelling Number and Family Number are artificial numbers used by the census enumerator.
2. The above census data was found a Fall of 1976 search by Dave Jordan. The record was located through the use of the Soundex system.
3. The number of marriage years matches with their marriage date of May 27, 1893.
4. The months and years of birth and ages match other data for all cases except that Fred was believed to be born June 6, 1899.
5. According to Dutch records, the year of immigration for Matthijs and Trijntje was March 1886 with four children. The four children are thought to be the four younger children: Matthijs, Jannetje, Cornelius and John.

1. Tanis generations previous to **Cornelis Dirksen Tanis** christened 7 August 1763 in Oudeland, Zuid-Holland (Indent A. above and author's gggg-grandfather) along with offspring for various related families may be found at [Tanis Family Overview](#).
2. Cornelis married his first wife Caatje Tijdsdr Heerschap on 29 April 1787. They had 6 children between May 1788 and April 1801 all born in Zuid-Holland, probably Ouddorp. Caatje died on 1 May 1801 possibly as a result of her last childbirth on 3 April 1801. The Shirley Stich line connects through Caatje and her son Paulus Tanis.
3. Cornelis married his 2nd wife Geertruda Evertsdr van der Sluijs on 19 October 1801. They had 4 children between April 1802 and January 1810 all born in Zuid-Holland, probably Ouddorp. The Jordan line connects through Geertruda and her son Dirk Cornelis Tanis. Dirk Cornelis and Paulus were half brothers.
4. There are a variety of spellings of Geertruda Evertsdr van der Sluijs. Some are Geertruda and Geertruid; Evertsdr, Everts, and Evers; van der Sluijs, vander Sluis, ver Sluis, and Sluijs. The spelling may depend on who did the recording. Also see note below on Dutch names. The variation Geertruda Evertsdr van der Sluijs was picked for consistency.
5. There are also variations of Cornelis Dirksen Tanis. Other variations are Dirkzoon and Dirkz. The variation Cornelis Dirksen Tanis was picked for consistency.
6. From the Genealogical Dutch Word list: "The suffixes -je, tje, -tien, or -ke are often added to words to indicate "little." Therefore, the word zoontje means "little" or "young (tje) son (zoon)." The ending -sdr means "daughter of."

Census Search History

This section contains information about census searches that were made for the Vanderkloot family lines.

Chicago Census

The 1900, 1910, 1920, 1930 and 1940 Chicago Censuses can be located using the Soundex system. The Soundex System uses a phonetic method to organize surnames. The value of the Soundex system is that a name can be found relatively easily even if names were spelled differently than the way they are expected to be spelled. Unusual spellings occurred for several reasons including census takers not always being careful in accurately recording the spelling of our ancestors' names or that our ancestors did not always spell their names in a consistent way.

The 1890 Census was destroyed by fire. All Jordan and Steward families arrived after the 1880 Census and thus the first available census to search is the 1900 Census.

Access to the Chicago Census, as part of the total U.S. Census, is readily available at a number of locations. In particular, searches have been made over the years at the National Archives in Washington D.C., the National Archive Regional Branch in Bayonne, New Jersey, the National Archive Regional Branch in Chicago, the Newberry Library in Chicago, and the Allen County Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Around the year 2000, the USA census data became increasingly available on-line. By 2010 all USA census information were available on-line via a number of websites and genealogy sites such as *Ancestry*, and *Footnote*.
